A pastor has said that "missions exists because worship doesn't." More specifically, missions exists because worship of Jesus Christ doesn't exist. Instead, the world is content worshipping created things versus the Creator Himself (Romans 1:25).

Last month, we celebrated Resurrection Sunday, otherwise known as Easter. This day of the year, more than any other, brings into focus who we worship and why we are compelled to move into full-time missions. (See the picture below of our family on Easter.) In our church specifically, we looked at the passage from Matthew 28:1-15 recounting when Mary and Mary Magdalene found the empty tomb. A particular verse (v. 9) brought to mind the above quote. "And behold, Jesus met them and greeted them. And they came up and took hold of His feet and worshiped Him." These women took hold of the risen Christ's feet and worshiped Him.



Since the day these women worshiped the resurrected Jesus, missions has existed to call people from every tribe, tongue, and nation to worship our risen Savior Jesus Christ. At SIM, we are working to mobilize and send out as many workers to the field as we can to take the gospel to those hard to reach areas of the globe. This last week four adults completed their last week of training in our home office of Charlotte to be sent out to South America, Africa, and Asia. Each of them are leaving well paying jobs, family, and friends to take the gospel to some of the least reached in the world.

Join with us as we pray for their final days here in the States as they fly out during the summer months to join the other 4,000 missionaries of SIM all over the world.

The daily call to worship Jesus continues to be a motivating voice in our hearts

as we take each day as it comes. Our family remains in Cypress, Texas as we work to trust God for His timing in the selling of our house. We continue to live life among our family and friends in Texas as we wait for the final pieces to fall into place to make our official move to Charlotte, North Carolina.

While we practice patience, we are meeting with as many family and friends who are willing to meet with us. This process has been encouraging and at times difficult. We see firsthand God's grace as many have joined our team as prayer and financial partners. We appreciate your prayers as we seek to remain faithful to our pursuit of adding partners to our team.

We hold tightly to the promise that God's mercies are new every morning (Lam. 3:23). Each day is a new beginning with His mercies. With new beginnings in mind, Nathan received his official office badge when he traveled to Charlotte in April and enjoyed office life with his new SIM family.
